Partnership with Western Theological Seminary (Graduate Certificate in Disability and Ministry)



KIN has partnered with Western Theological Seminary (WTS), a premier Reformed seminary in Michigan, USA, to provide further training opportunities in the area of practical disability ministry. WTS' Center for Disability and Ministry offers an excellent fully-online **Graduate Certificate in Disability and Ministry** (GCDM).

The GCDM comprises 21-credit hours of training by world-leading experts in disability ministry. KIN's partnership with WTS allows students who have completed CCDM to matriculate into the GCDM with a 25% discount on all GCDM course fees.

The Leaena Tambyah Scholarship for Disability Ministry

KIN has established the Leaena Tambyah Scholarship for Disability Ministry. The scholarship's aim is to develop clergy, church staff members, and lay disability ministry leaders who have the potential to contribute to Singapore's disability ministry landscape.

The scholarship is named after Mrs Leaena Tambyah, a Christian sister who founded Singapore's first school for children with multiple disabilities (now AWWA School). Mrs Tambyah also played a significant role in advocating for compulsory education for children with disabilities in Singapore.

The scholarship will provide a SGD4,000 grant to eligible candidates who have been accepted to study at Western Theological Seminary's Graduate Certificate of Disability and Ministry programme. To apply for the scholarship, fill-in the application form in this link.
